At the handover event at Henshaws centre on Talbot Road, representatives from Vision enjoyed meeting children, parents and staff. The actor Danny Miller who plays Emmerdale's Aaron Livesy attended the event.

Larry Davis, Executive Director of Vision said: "Vision Charity is delighted to continue its relationship with Henshaws whose work we admire so much. We know that this equipment will be put to good use and that it will make a huge difference to the children and families that have access to it."
